The Schools involved, played table cricket and/or softball cricket. The High School Leckhampton, and Mangotsfield school won the county competitions, and went onto the Regional competitions The High School Leckhampton, were successful at the Regional, and went onto represent the Midlands at Lords last July. There they played well and enjoyed the day.

Softball festivals were run throughout the county, both as Non Stop cricket and kwik cricket festivals

County Teams

D40 team, played in the National Disability D40 Pursuit South West League last year. Matches are 40 overs. It was the 2nd year we have had a team at this level, and had 2 convincing wins against Wales, other results were close losses. As a team, the players have all played well, but were affected by the number of injuries this year.

S9 performance team, played in the National Disability S9 Performance Midlands league. Matches are 30 overs standard cricket. This was the first time we have competed in the

league, and although results were disappointing, the team as a whole played well, but were affected by a number of injuries.

S9 Development team, had a successful season, playing numerous matches against Somerset and Oxfordshire both as pairs and as 30 overs

8 cricket clubs continue to support the disability cricketers, with venues for Super1s, county teams, and running their own sessions both softball cricket and table cricket. We hope that more clubs will become involved next year, allowing more players to play
